

MULTIDIMENSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

For all children

The multi-dimensional development programs utilize a multitude of resources and are primarily divided in two areas. The first is expert visits. Here resource persons are invited to engage children on a given topic. The second part is a field visit or exposure visits where children get to explore and immerse themselves in the world around them.


Our main focus was to keep the children creatively engaged and boost their motivation as the children returned back to the centers, from the partial lockdown,

HIGHLIGHTS

- MasterCard volunteers from all over India initiated online sessions for children on topics related to communication and personality development
- After the restrictions were lifted, picnic was the first thing on the children's mind. The groups were divided age wise and they were taken to different locations.
- Art with heart - Children enhanced their creativity skills through a variety of art and craft work
- Role plays were encouraged after reading and/or listening to stories
- Children learned to plan and organize through a session on Swayampak (cooking)
- Library time for silent reading was created to improve students' understanding so that they could enjoy stories and improve their comprehension.
- Through *Your Brilliant Brain*, children became aware of their brain's functions and developed an understanding on the impact of the various experiences of the brain
- A few girls from the Samvad group attended a session hosted by Withyaa Kaladhara to learn a variety of craft work from Pyrography to Cement Work
- 15 girls got a chance to learn Bharatnatyam, an Indian classical dance form. Swapnil Dalvi, a trained Bharatnatyam dancer and an architect volunteered once a week to teach the children



- Teach different coping strategies




RIPPLE EFFECT - INSTITUTIONS (WITH YOUTH)

We live in a world where many children get mixed messages of shame and inadequacy. At AURA we support a different reality. We have faith in each child’s wholeness and innocence. We believe that LOVE is the answer and once the LOVE tank is fuller, children astound us with their creativity, their potential and their ability to deliver.

What the teacher models is what the child mirrors and learns. So children at AURA develop a deeper sensitivity towards fellow humans and the world. They develop more empathy and non-judgmental acceptance of others.

Care & Compassion - dimension of Soul

Every learning unit emphasises a big picture view for an understanding of the community and the world, and how everything fits together. Children become aware of the impact of actions and consequences; of choice and responsibility and the dynamics of relationship. They also deepen self-connection by becoming aware of feelings and needs and more ease to express them.

OUR WORK

AURA offers long-term and intense Programs at our own centers, where the group of learners receive almost 250 hours of intervention each year. The programs are progressive and move through creativity in SARJAN, building connections in SAMVAD and contribution through leadership in SAMBHAV. We also run a program, Sau Ka Jadoo, to inspire community to volunteer 100 hours of their time per year to help the less fortunate to learn something new.






